



**Wisconsin Association of Independent Colleges and Universities (WAICU) Joint Commitment to Accept Student Military Transfer Credit 2021-2022**

**Credit for Advanced Training**

ACE recommendations for the amount and level of credit (upper or lower division) are followed if the military course is applicable to the WAICU-member college or university's academic guidelines, which may vary by department or program of study. Each college or university determines the number of credits they will accept, and how they will be applied toward a specific degree. ### Definitions:

- Elective: This credit may count toward the total number credits required to graduate, and in some cases, may count towards direct credit required for a program of study/major.
- Direct Credit toward a Major/Program: Credit from courses required for a particular major or program of study, as prescribed by the particular college or university.
- General education credit: Each college or university requires a set of general education or “core” courses in order to graduate. These courses are typically in areas of math, science, humanities, arts and/or languages, and requirements will vary depending on the college or university.
