

Increase Student Aid Funding to Keep Talent in Our State, Grow Workforce



Wisconsin has fallen significantly behind its neighbors in state support to low-income college students.

Wisconsin's economy will continue to need college-educated employees with projections indicating that by 2031, 72 percent of all jobs will require some postsecondary education.

To make our state competitive and attract much-needed college students to fill these important jobs, we're asking state legislators to double our current appropriation of \$57 million in the 2025— 2027 biennium budget for a total two-year funding of \$114 million. These funds would support our low- and middle-income Wisconsin Private Colleges students, bringing Wisconsin closer in line with need-based grants in neighboring states.

As we enter a new year and a new state budget cycle, we want to consider the future of Wisconsin's workforce and economy. One pressing issue for our future is ensuring that higher education remains accessible and

This is why the Wisconsin Association of Independent Colleges and Universities (WAICU) is urging state legislators to double the Wisconsin Grant in the 2025–2027 biennial budget—increasing funding from \$57 million to \$114 million.

Mount Mary to Harness AI Power to Narrow Gap of Health Disparities


